Dear NAA Members.

While the Farm Bill stalled in 2023 and 2024 and likely won't pass until early 2025, U.S. aquaculture has exciting provisions included in the current drafts: creating an aquaculture advisory committee to the Secretary of Agriculture, waiving the adjusted gross income limitation, recognizing drought as an eligible cause of loss for USDA disaster assistance, and increasing the funding for USDA Regional Aquaculture Centers. As we go into 2025, we need all members to advocate and help get these priorities finalized in the Farm Bill!

Outside of the Farm Bill, we remain laser focused on federal improvements: coordinating with USDA APHIS to improve aquatic animal import/export, amending the Endangered Species Act to create a captive-bred exemption, amending the Migratory Bird Treaty Act to authorize USDA depredating bird permitting, increasing the number of FDA approved aquatic animal therapeutants, educating departments of Agriculture, Commerce, Environmental Protection, Health and Human Services, and Interior staff about aquaculture farms, and reducing the federal-state regulatory burden.
